 motion that the discovery in this matter consists of approximately 6,000 pages of business records and other documents.

He attached to the motion a working outline of the discovery material produced to date which gives insight in the nature and the amount of discovery. He requested a continuance of 120 days to allow adequate time to review the said discovery and prepare adequately for trial. In the motion, Hoskins said he had consulted with Sallee about the need of a continuance and informed her of her rights under the speedy trial act. Sallee consents and agrees with the continuance as requested. Further counsel stated that he had conferred with United States Attorneys handling this matter and was advised the government had no objections to the requested continuance.

Hoskins motion was filed on Thursday, July 12 electronically with the clerk of the court. In response, Judge Boom filed an order granting motion to continue jury trial and motion to designation as complex on Friday, July 13 stating having reviewed the motion and response and the court being otherwise sufficiently advised it is hereby ordered as follows defendant Beth N. Sallee's motion to continue jury trial and motion for designation for complex is granted. She also confirms the jury trial is rescheduled for Tuesday, December 11, 2018, and the final pretrial conference for Tuesday, December 4, 2018. All counsel who plan to participate at trial shall attend the conference Boom said.

intersection of HWY 3437 (Morrill-Kerby Knob Road) and HWY 421 and crossed the centerline and hit the Sparks vehicle.

Shields was first arrested on January 4, 2017 when state police said meth was found in her SUV the day of the crash. She was then charged with possession of a controlled substance 1st degree 1st offense and drug paraphernalia-buy/possess.

She appeared in district court on January 9 and plead not guilty to the drug charges.

However, in April, the Jackson County Grand Jury returned an indictment against Shields by adding two counts of murder, one for each Sparks victim and one count of operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or other intoxicants, as well as other charges relating to the accident including wanton endangerment 1st degree for the injuries Josephine Sparks received in the crash. Josephine Sparks is the wife of one of the fatality victims.

After the grand jury returned the indictment, Shields, who had been released on the drug charges in early January, was arrested and currently remains at the Jackson County Detention Center at press time.

a paid training period is complete—along with a \$500 bonus, per company officials. Pending background checks by the company, applicants who were offered employment during the Teleworks USA hiring events would start paid training July 30 and would transition to full employment by Aug. 6.
